

We are pleased to present to you this year's Annual Quality Water Report. This report is designed to inform you about the quality of water and services we deliver to you every day. Our constant goal is and has always been, to provide you a safe and dependable supply of drinking water. We want you to understand the efforts we make to continually improve our water supply and protect our water resources. We are committed to insuring the quality of your water. We have two sources of water: 1) Groundwater: Our groundwater is drawn from the Cache Creek alluvium by four wells, located west of Walters. 2) Surface water: purchased from the City of Lawton, which is treated water from Lake Lawtonka.

This report shows our water quality and what it means. If you have any questions about this report or concerning your water utility, please contact Karen Bishop at (580) 355-1343. We want our customers to be informed about their water. If you want to learn more, please attend any of our regularly scheduled meetings. They are held on the first Tuesday of every month, 7:00 pm, at the district's office located at 5845 SE 90th

Comanche County Rural Water District No. 3 routinely monitors for constituents in your drinking water according to Federal and State laws. The following table shows the monitoring results of our groundwater source for the period of January 1st to December 31, 2014 (some of our data may be more than one year old because the state allows us to monitor for some contaminants less often then once a year.) and a copy of the monitoring results from the City of Lawton on the water we purchased during the time period above. All drinking water, including bottled drinking water, may be reasonably expected to contain at least small amounts of some constituents. It's important to remember that the presence of these constituents

does not necessarily pose a health risk. In the table below you will find many terms and abbreviations you might not be familiar with. To help you better understand these terms we've provided the following definitions: Non-Detects (ND) – laboratory analysis indicates that the constituent is not present. Parts per million (ppm) or Milligrams per liter (mg/l), Parts per billion (ppb) or Micrograms per liter (ug/l) Picocuries per liter (pCi/L) – picocuries per liter is a measure of the radioactivity in water. Action Level (AL) – The concentration of a contaminant, which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements, which a water system must follow. Treatment Technique (TT) - A treatment technique is a required process intended to reduce the level of a contaminant in drinking water. Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) - The MCL is the highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available treatment technology. Maximum Contaminant Level Goal (MCGL) - The MCLG is the level of a contaminant in drinking water below, which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety. MCL's are very stringent levels. To understand the possible health effects described for many regulated constituents, a person would have to drink 2 liters of water every day at the MCL level for a lifetime to have a one-in-a-million chance of having the described health effect.

There are seventy-six regulated contaminants that community water systems are required to test for including microbiological, radioactive, inorganic, synthetic organic including pesticides, and herbicides, and volatile organic contaminants. The tables below show only those contaminants that are detected. The first table is for our groundwater source. The second table is for the water purchased from the City of Lawton. We have a source water protection plan available from our office that shows the vulnerability to be high in our



Parting Shots



This shot of Matt Winburn working on a transformer shows some of the safety equipment Shelly Sehrt tests (see story, Page 11). The long orange pole is called a hot stick. The insulated device extends a lineman's reach. The elbow-length rubber gloves are Class 3, indicated by the green label. They should withstand up to 30,000 volts. Leather protectors go over the rubber gloves to prevent punctures. Rubber sleeves extend from Winburn's shoulders and tuck into the rubber gloves. While not tested, a hard hat, safety glasses and a fire-retardant long-sleeved shirt also protect the lineman. A blue harness tethers him to the insulated bucket as a fall-restraint.
